Dave & his wife, Kim, were married in 2002. She owns a cleaning business and works part-time at Mercy Hospital. They live in Fairfield Township.

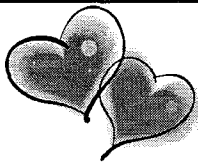

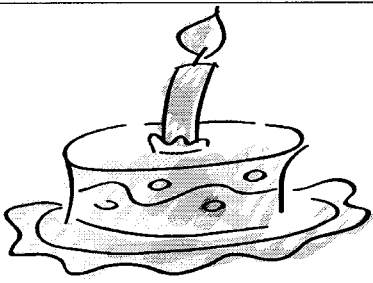
