Location: Fairfield Community Arts Center—867-5348

Description: A special performance of George Frideric Handel's *Messiah*, the well-known and loved holiday masterpiece. *Messiah* remains Handel's best-known work, especially memorable to many for the Hallelujah chorus. The libretto for *Messiah* was designed and selected from the New and Old Testaments with utmost care by Charles Jennens (1700-73), a literary scholar. Across the span of 250 years, *Messiah* still holds its extraordinary grip on musician and audience member alike. Maestro Paul Stanbery conducts the Hamilton Fairfield Symphony Orchestra.
